If there is any political clout in the city, now is the time to use it.</p>	<p>These comments will be passed on to the school district.</p> <p>The City of Sequim recently hired a new IT Manager who is tasked with assessing the IT Department, including infrastructure improvement, staffing needs, daily processes and procedures, as well as long term strategies.
