| Blake Avenue                   | A new entrance is being developed for Carrie Blake Park. People were concerned about speeding on Blake Avenue and the needed additions of cross walks and ADA cuts in the sidewalk. Speed issues need to be brought to the attention of the Police Department.  |
| Rhodefer Road exit from park   | A chain could be put up every night except the street sweeper comes early in the morning.   |
| Haller Fields                  | There is concern about traffic leaving Music in the Park. People need to be aware there is soccer practice on the fields and young people do not always look before they run out into the parking area  |
| Dumpsters at Carrie Blake Park | People are using the park dumpsters for their own trash. The park docent suggested signage.   |
| Opioid epidemic                | There was concern about the ongoing problem. Charlie and Chief Crain provided feedback about the things that are being done now as all jurisdictions are now on board with addressing the problem. One citizen was also made aware that there is a container in the lobby of the Civic Center where drugs can be taken to be disposed of. |
| Hendrickson Road extension     | There was some discussion by Charlie about the extension for Hendrickson Rd from Sequim Ave to Brown Rd. This will include a change to the Olympic Discovery Trail. Most in attendance were very much in favor of that happening and were surprised to learn about the varied ownership of that road. They thought it was all City.       |
| Fir Street project             | Discussed the many facets of the upcoming Fir Street project. Again most were not aware of the varied ownership of Fir from Sequim Ave to 5th. The question also came up about the community school being torn down. What is going to replace it?   |
| September 9 event at Guy Cole  | There is a partnership with Habitat for Humanity that includes several events in the park in 2018. There was a lot of interest from those in attendance.  |
