

An Email From Police Chief Sheri Crain

Our k-9 program began in 2000 when we took over a County k-9, Huey, when the CCSO ended their k-9 program. Rather immediately, the community became a champion of the program and the dogs. Donations to support our k-9's have been near constant since then. We do very little to solicit them, just demonstrate our level of professionalism with demonstrations and interactions with the public. Case in point, around the time Chase became ill, we were approached by the Halloran foundation. This family foundation with a connection to Sequim and an affinity for k-9's in general, and police k-9's in particular, approached us with a grant to procure and train our next k-9. That generous grant paid for and trained Mamba in full. Our donation fund is healthy and more than sustainable far into the future, certainly for the working life of Mamba.

Since 2013, we've collected \$43,363 in donations and grant money for the K-9 Program. We've spent a little over \$31k, including purchasing our current dog.

The current balance of the fund is over \$27k. Our budget for spending this year is \$7,500 (which is not shown below).
