Hello Hansi,

Thank you for your call this morning and meeting with me a couple weeks ago regarding our Lavender Meadows project in Sequim. Enclosed is a report by Joanne Bartlett, a Senior Biologist with Ecological Land Services, regarding the irrigation ditch that crosses our property.

In a letter from Randy to the City dated July 30, 2019, a request was made that if there is an open ditch through the project, a 15' wide water quality buffer should be provided for on either side of the ditch. I'm enclosing proposed draft conditions to provide for these buffers if the ditch is not piped. These conditions comply with the Sequim Prairie Tri-Irrigation Association requirements for irrigation ditches within City limits.

Thank you all for your interest in our project and we hope that the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe will fully support this high quality, affordable community in Sequim as we do our best to address your concerns.
